Following Augie's birth, they spent the first six weeks in the St. Mary's NICU while he had one surgery and waited for his open-heart surgery when he was three months old at AFCH. While living in Sun Prairie was not far away from St. Mary's, they took advantage of the opportunity to stay at the Family Room to stay close to their son.

While Augie requires a couple extra doctor appointments here and there (often at AFCH), his health is great, and he has been an incredible blessing to the family! After their family life got back into a groove, Nick and Melissa were seeking ways to give back and get further engaged in the community. Nick specifically remembered their visit at the RMHC Family Room and the respite they received while caring for their son. He recalled seeing a list of potential donation items on the Family Room front desk but felt that he needed to give back in a bigger way. Nick engaged with RMHC and subsequently agreed to join the board.
